Mulberry have been finding out about Chinese New Year. They made and painted some lovely lanterns and after reading a fact book, completed their own writing about it.




#### Years 3 and 4

**RSPB Big School Birdwatch** 

On Friday 26th January Dr Gardner's Science Club took part in the RSPB Big Schools' Birdwatch. Two groups went to Forest School and quietly watched for birds each for 30 minutes. In our hour we counted a wide range of birds including blackbirds, sparrow, blue tits, woodpigeons, seagulls and starlings. The most common bird we saw was the blackbird (42) and a total of 174 birds were counted during the hour. We sent off our results and had much higher bird counts than most gardens.
