Studies show that children with attendance above 96% make better progress socially and academically. With the development of the curriculum that has taken place over recent years, children who are absent will find gaps in their sequential knowledge. For our younger children, both attendance and punctuality are doubly important as they move straight into their phonics groups after the register has been taken.
